

# FUSION CHALLENGE

## PROGRAM (NEW SPRING 2022)



### **What is the Challenge Program?**

The Challenge League is for players who love the game of soccer and want to challenge themselves with more than what is offered at the recreational level. This will act as the bridge between Recreation soccer and Classic soccer. The Challenge League gives a unique opportunity for the 'multi-sport athlete' who wishes to compete in a variety of sports in the same season.

### **Who is it for?**

Players born in 2010 or 2011 will have a spring season that will include two practices per week and eight games over four alternating weekends. Games will be played on Sunday afternoons at Truist Sports Park (Bermuda Run) and at either Bryan Park or Proehlific Park (Greensboro). Additionally, Challenge players will be registered for NC Fusion's spring end-of-season tournament, the NC Fusion Cup.

### **Why should I join the Challenge League?**

The Challenge League features local travel, convenient training, and game locations, and is affordable, fun, and competitive. The Challenge League offers twice the training of Level 4 Recreation soccer, but only half the weekend commitments needed for Level 2 Classic soccer.

### **Who will be coaching?**

Paid and Certified Parent-Coaches will be implementing the NC Fusion Challenge curriculum. Coaching education, support, and direction will be provided by Bryn Lloyd, the Director of the Challenge League.

### **Cost?**

\$350 per season which includes 8 games and one end of season tournament.

### **How do we join the program?**

- 2) Select your preferred practice location.
- 3) Team Assignments released by February 21st, 2022
